

sakarat[®] D LIQUID BAIT

0.005%w/w(0.05g/Kg) Difenacoum

For use against Rats and Mice Indoors and Outdoors around buildings: Rattus norvegicus (brown rat) and Mus musculus (house mice).

APPLICATION RATE:

RATS: A maximum of 250ml of product placed in a bait station every 5-10m depending on the level of infestation.

MICE: A maximum of 100ml of product placed in a bait station every 2-5m depending on the level of infestation.

APPLICATION METHODS:

Bart bottles will be opened by removing the childproof-cap without breaking the membrane, the roll-on dispenser will then be connected to the bottle. Once inverted, the bait bottle and connected dispenser will be placed in the bait station.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE-

To be used only by professional users holding certification demonstrating compliance with UK rodenticide stewardship regime requirements.

Read the label before use. Using this product in a manner that is inconsistent with the label may be an offence. Refer to the CRRU UK Code of Best Practice (or equivalent) for guidance.

When this product is supplied to a user for the control of rodents, it shall only be supplied to a professional user holding certification demonstrating compliance with UK rodenticide stewardship regime requirements.

Because of their delayed mode of action, anticoagulant rodenticides take from 4 to 10 days to be effective after consumption of the bait.

Remove the remaining product at the end of treatment period.

Where possible, prior to the treatment inform any possible bystanders (e.g. users of the treated area and their surroundings) about the rodent control campaign.

Consider preventive control measures (e.g. plug holes, remove potential food and drinking as far as possible) to improve product intake and reduce the likelihood of reinvasion.

To reduce risk of secondary poisoning, search for and remove dead rodents during treatment at frequent intervals, in line with the recommendations provided by the relevant code of best practice.

Do not use this product as permanent baits for the prevention of rodent infestation or monitoring of rodent activities.

Do not use this product in pulsed baiting treatments

Protect bait from the atmospheric conditions. Place the baiting points in areas non-liable to flooding.

Replace any bait in baiting points in which bait has been damaged by water or contaminated by dirt.

Do not apply this product directly in the burrows.

Read and follow the product information as well as any information accompanying the product or provided at the point of sale before using it.

Carry out a pre-baiting survey of the infested area and an on-site assessment order to identify the rodent species, their places of activity and determine the likely cause and the extent of the infestation.

Remove food which is readily attainable for rodents (e.g. spilled grain or food waste). Apart from this, do not dean up the infested area just before the treatment, as this noyl disturbs the rodent population and makes bait acceptance more difficult to achieve.

The product should only be used as part of an integrated pest management (IPM) system, including, amongst others, hygiene measures and, where possible, physical methods of control.

The product should be placed in the immediate vicinity of places where rodent

activity has been previously explored (e.g. travel paths, nesting sites, feedlots, holes, burrows etc.).

Where possible, bait stations must be fixed to the ground or other structures.

Bait stations must be clearly labelled to show they contain rodenticides and that they must not be moved or opened.

Bait should be secured so that it cannot be dragged away from the bait station. Place the product out of the reach of children, birds, pets and farm animals and other non-target animals.

Place the product away from food, drink and animal feeding stuffs, as well as from utensils or surfaces that have contact with these.

Wear protective chemical resistant gloves during product handling phase (to EN374).

When using the product do not eat, drink or smoke. Wash hands and directly

exposed skin after using the product.

The frequency of visits to the treated area should be at the discretion of the operator, in the light of the survey conducted at the outset of the treatment. That frequency should be consistent with the recommendations provided by

the CRRUUK Code of Best Practice (or equivalent).

If bait uptake is low relative to the apparent size of the infestation, consider the replacement of bait points to further places and the possibility to change to another bait formulation.

If after a treatment period of 35 days baits are continued to be consumed and no decline in rodent activity can be observed, the likely cause has to be determined. Where other elements have been excluded, it is likely that there are resistant rodent so consider the use of a non-anticoagulant rodenticide, where available, or a more potent anticoagulant rodenticide. Also consider the use of traps as an alternative control measure.

Fix the bait station to the ground

In case of accidental spillage of the liquid, dispose of the bait station as hazardous waste.

Do not use in areas where resistance to the active substance can be suspected. Products shall not be used beyond 35 days without an evaluation of the state of the infestation and of the efficacy of the treatment.

Do not rotate the use of different anticoagulants with comparable or weaker potency for resistance management purposes. For rotational use, consider using a non-anticoagulant rodenticide, if available, or a more potent anticoagulant.

Do not wash the bait stations or utensils used in covered and protected bait points with water between applications.

Dispose dead rodents in accordance with local requirement

In the UK poisoned rodents may be disposed of by the waste producer at an incinerator or landfill permitted to accept that type of waste, or rollected by a registered waste carrier and taken for disposal at a suitably permitted site. Rodents can be disease carriers. Do not touch dead rodents with bare hands, use glowes or use tools such as tongs when disposing them.

This product contains a bittering agent and a dye.

THE PARTICULARS OF LIKELY DIRECT OR INDIRECT EFFECTS, FIRST AID INSTRUCTIONS AND EMERGENCY MEASURES TO PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT

This product contains an anticoagulant substance. If ingested, symptoms, which may be delayed, may include nosebleed and bleeding gums. In severe cases, there may be bruising and blood present in the faeces or urine.

Antidote: Vitamin K1 administered by medical/veterinary personnel only In case of:

- Dermal exposure, wash skin with water and then with water and soap.
- Eye exposure, rinse eyes with eyes-rinse liquid or water, keep eyes lids open at least 10 minutes.
- Oral exposure, rinse mouth carefully with water. Never give anything by

mouth to unconscious person. Do not provoke vomiting. If swallowed, seel medical advice immediately and show the product's container or label.

Contact a veterinary surgeon in case of ingestion by a pet.

Bait stations must be labelled with the following information: "do not move or open"; "contains a rodenticide"; "product name or authorisation number"; "active substance(s)" and "in case of accident, call a poison centre."

When placing bait points close to water drainage systems, ensure that bait

When placing bait points close to surface waters (e.g. rivers, ponds, water channels, dykes, irrigation ditches) or water drainage systems, ensure that bait contact with water is avoided.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SAFE DISPOSAL OF THE PRODUCT AND ITS PACKAGING

At the end of the treatment, dispose of uneaten bait and the packaging in accordance with local requirements. Use of gloves is recommended.

STEP 1

Hold the bottle with the cap facing up. Remove the security cap by pushing down and twisting.



STEP 2

Without removing the safety seal, insert the bottle feeder by applying pressure on it until you feel that the seal has broken. Turn 360 degrees to make sure the seal has completely broken. Apply pressure to the bottle feeder until you hear a 'click'. This will confirm that it is correctly fixed to the bottle.



STEP 3

Apply the base and remove black plastic cap.



STEP 4

Turn the unit upside down and place inside the bait box.



STEP 5

If the unit needs to be moved before total consumption of the liquid bait, replace black plastic cap to avoid any leakage.
